

### **Competition Policy**

Structure, Requirements, Categories, Ranking and Officials



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#### 1 Structure

#### 1.1 Disciplines

- Lead: Climbs ('Routes') are climbed with the competitor clipping into protection points as they climb (on "Lead"). Progression along the line of the route determines a competitor's ranking.
- **Bouldering**: Short climbs ('Boulders') are attempted without ropes but with landing mats for protection. The number of boulders completed determines a competitor's ranking.
- **Speed**: Climbs are attempted with an in-situ rope (on "Top-Rope"). The time to complete the route determines a competitor's ranking.

#### 1.2 Competition in Australia


- Regional events and competitions: These events are organized by climbing facilities and/or SCA Member States. Rules and governance of these events is at the discretion of the organiser. The Youth event and Open event may be held at different dates.
- State Titles: State Titles may be held in each state once a year for each discipline. All SCA Guidelines and Policies apply to these events. It is possible for a competition to be held as a multiple state competition. In that case, podiums and ranking points will be split. The Youth event and Open event may be held at different dates.
- National Championships: National Championships are held once a year. All SCA Guidelines and Policies apply to these events. The Youth event and Open event may be held at different dates.

#### 1.3 Rules and Policies

Rules for the three disciplines are the official Sport Climbing Australia Rules. These can be found at sportclimbingaustralia.com.au. The speed rules are not yet written and SCA uses the official IFSC rules as a guideline.



### **1.4** Officials Hierarchy (state and national events)



The Jury president (JP) has overall authority in the competition area. The JP works closely to Head Judge, Belayer Coordinator and Chief Route Setters. Some events may not have a Head Judge or Belayer Coordinator. In that case the Jury President will take these roles.

### 1.5 Membership Requirements

All participants in an SCA sanctioned event in a specific calendar year must have a valid Sport Climbing Australia membership for this calendar year prior to the commencement of the event. Any participant failing to do so will have their Ranking Points, Titles and Medal revoked. They will also not appear in the result sheet for the event.

A State level membership is required for participating in the State Title. An individual with a state membership is only allowed to participate in the state title of the state that they have declared as their state of affiliation.

A National level membership is required for participating in to other state titles than the one of affiliation, National, Continental and International Championships.

### 1.6 Anti-Doping

• SCA will endeavor to conduct drug testing through the services of ASADA at one or more state or national event each year. ASADA will be conducting random drug testing at national competitions.



### 2 Competition Requirements

#### 3 Categories, Titles, Medals and RP

#### 3.1 Definitions

State of affiliation: The state of affiliation for each competitor is as declared when signing up for a membership with Sport Climbing Australia. The state of affiliation cannot be changed during a calendar year. At a state title, competitors with that state of affiliation are state competitors. Other competitors are interstate competitors.

Titles: At each State Titles and National Championship and for each category a Title is earned by the 1<sup>st</sup> competitor in that category.

Medals: Medals (or trophies) are offered to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> competitor in each category (sometimes referred to as Gold, Silver and bronze).

Prizes: At the discretion of the competition organiser placing in each category may be linked to a prize (in the form of cash or any other prize).

#### 3.2 Categories

#### **Category List**

- Youth A, B, C, D, Junior, Masters (40+) and Open A are the official categories.
- Youth X category may be created for competitors younger than Youth D.
- Open B will also be included in all events
- Open C may be included in a competition when appropriate and practical at the discretion of the competition organisers.
- At the discretion of the controlling body in each state and SCA at national level, categories may be run on separate dates.

#### **Category Age**

- SCA follows age categories as designated by the IFSC however the change of category will occur earlier. The change of category occurs after the Selection Event for the National Team is finalized and prior to the start of the state title season.
- To avoid confusion, IFSC categories and SCA categories are the same at the beginning of the year however the SCA categories will change during the year while the IFSC categories change at the end of the calendar year.
- Junior and Youth A competitors are permitted to compete in Open categories. Younger competitors are not permitted to compete in Open categories.
- Masters climbers can choose to compete in Masters and/or Open A when the competition allows it.

#### 3.3 Interstate Competitors at State Titles

- Any National level SCA member can compete at any SCA sanctioned State Titles.
- Any of the competitors are eligible for **Ranking Points and Prizes**, regardless of their current state of affiliation.
- Medals and Titles will only be awarded to climbers competing in their state of affiliation eg. the NSW Champion must be affiliated to the state of NSW. The state of affiliation is as declared when applying for membership and is displayed on the membership card. It can only be changed when requested in writing with justification. Also, in that case the state of affiliation will be used for all events in that calendar year. A competitor cannot win multiple State Titles or Medals.

#### 3.4 Overseas Guest Competitors

- Overseas guest competitors are competitors who are not Australian citizens and not currently residing in Australia. Their state of affiliation is declared as "international".
- Overseas guest competitors are entitled to ranking points.
- Prizes may be awarded to overseas guest climbers who earn them at the discretion of the event organiser.
- Overseas guest competitors are not entitled to ear Titles or Medals at any state title or national championship
- A National Title can only be awarded to an Australian Citizen.
- Overseas guest competitors who make it to a final or semi-final do so as part of the final or semi-final quota, with no extra places for other competitors
- Overseas guest competitors should be clearly marked in the results table

### 3.6 National Ranking

National Ranking will be for each of the Official IFSC disciplines: Lead, Boulder and Speed. Ranking Points are awarded at all SCA endorsed competitions that are designated as State Titles or National Championships.

National Rankings will apply for males and females in the following categories: Open A, Junior, Youth A, Youth B, Youth C, Youth D, Masters

National Ranking will be made at the end of each calendar year

Competitors will be allocated Ranking Points for the category they compete in. Some climbers may be allocated Ranking Points in multiple categories.
